Dallas Historical Society announces community service award winners

The **Dallas Historical Society** has announced the 2014 recipients of its Awards for Excellence in Community Service.

Glenn and Margaret Solomon will chair the luncheon Nov. 20 at the **Fairmont Dallas Hotel**. **Lee Cullum** and **Laura Wilson** are the honorary chairs.

Lynn and Allen McBee are co-chairs of the Dallas Historical Society.

The 2014 recipients are:

Arts leadership: Kevin Moriarty.

Moriarty, director of the **Dallas Theater Center**, has developed initiatives between the theater center and other nonprofit groups. He also hosted the **Theatre Communications Group's** national meeting in the Arts District.

Creative arts: Judy and Patrick Kelly.

Patrick is a theater director and Judy a producer of Emmy Award-winning documentaries on performing and visual arts, architecture and urban design. They were co-founders of the drama department at the **University of Dallas**.

Business: Bob Estrada.

Estrada is the founding chairman of **Estrada Hinojosa & Co.**, a financial adviser and bond underwriting firm. He has served on the board of directors of the **Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas** and has done volunteer work with civic, arts and community-based organizations.

Education: Mike and Mary Terry.

The Terrys are active in **St. Rita's Catholic Church, Ursuline Academy, Jesuit Preparatory School** and the **University of Dallas**. Through the **Mike and Mary Terry Foundation**, they focus on providing equal opportunities for children and ensuring a haven for those in need.

Medicine: Claude Prestidge.

Prestidge recently retired after 42 years of practice as a pediatrician. He founded the cystic fibrosis clinic at **Children's Medical Center Dallas** and has dedicated his life to research into causes and treatment of this disease.

Medical research: Bruce Beutler and Johann Deisenhofer.

UT Southwestern Medical Center's most recent Nobel laureate, Beutler was honored in 2011 for his research that determined the bacterial cause of septic shock. A Nobel laureate in chemistry, Deisenhofer identified a previously unknown protein molecule in the photosynthesis process.

Humanities: S.M. Wright Foundation.

Building on the generosity provided by the late Rev. S.M. Wright, the foundation focuses on serving the people of South Dallas and Fair Park. Its holiday event, Christmas in the Park, grew from serving 50 or so families to a citywide event that draws 20,000 people who need a meal, shoes and clothing as well as toys, bicycles, books and groceries.

Philanthropy: Stuart Bumpas.

Bumpas, a partner at **Locke Lord LLP** and an expert in taxes, employee benefits and

nonprofit organizations, has donated legal services to dozens of organizations throughout his career, including the **Callier Center for Communications Disorders** and the **Dallas Museum of Art**.

Volunteer community leadership: Judy Rorrie.

Rorrie volunteers more than 60 hours a week as the unpaid head of **North Dallas Shared Ministries**, which provides emergency help for families in five North Dallas ZIP codes. Rorrie has a paid staff of only two support employees and a half-time medical professional.

Jubilee history maker: Natalie (Schatzie) Lee.

With multiple degrees in art history from **Wellesley College**, **Stanford University** and **SMU**, this **Hockaday School** graduate's most recent publication is *The Hockaday School: An Anthology of Voices and Views, 1913-2013*. The former head docent at the Dallas Museum of Art, Lee has also volunteered many hours to **Friends of Fair Park**, **Junior League**, Dallas Historical Society and Hockaday.
